Information Session - 6:30p - 7:00p

- Megan (Melcher) Aniton, Assistant Attorney General, DC OAG - Human Sex Trafficking Awareness
 - Youth in DC not prosecuted for prostitution due to law passed years ago. Work with many orgs throughout the city to help victims and offer services for help. Discussed how youth are lured into trafficking, how to identify victims of sex trafficking and contact authorities to get them help.
- Amalgamated Transit Union (ATU) - DC Circulator
 - Didn't show
- Stacey Hemby - GA Ave dedicated bus lane update:
 - Dedicated buses for some segments of Georgia Ave, from Barry Pl NW to Florida Ave NW. The buses are scheduled to start on Monday, April 11th and will operate from Monday-Friday, 7 am-10 pm. DDOT will conduct a data analysis three weeks post start. There will be no parking and fines will be issued for \$200 from MPD. DDOT will provide update with the ANC Transportation Committee. If anyone has any questions, feel free to reach him at his office which is located on 2200 Georgia Ave NW.
- Matthew Robinson, 965 FL Ave PUD update
 - 450 units, three levels of underground parking for grocery stores and residential units. They are going to build a new street on 9th St to Sherman Ave. Reconfiguring section at Florida Ave and Sherman Ave and W St and Florida Ave (traffic signal to allow pedestrians to cross the streets safely). Loading dock will be on the new street. 10 stories, 9 residential and 1 business. Spoke about the design of the buildings, specifications, green area space, grant programs for the community (job training), RFPs, local retailers assistance program - teaming up with shaw streets to assist businesses in the area through the application process).

Community Announcements (10 minutes)

Daniel Jackson III, HBCU alliance 5K run and 1K walk, are estimating to have 2,000 people participate on June 25, 2016 (HBCU Day). Recommendation: The ANC modify the Settlement Agreement with U Street Music Hall to remove language requiring minimum food sales.

Transportation Committee (7 minutes)

Arcadia Mobile Market

Recommendation: The ANC vote to support Arcadia's weekly Mobile Market stop at Ledroit Park with a letter of support to the Department of Transportation and held until DDOT receipt.

Motion passes with unanimous consent.

Compass Coffee's New Sidewalk Cafe (Un-enclosed) - 1921 8th St. NW, 1B01,

Recommendation: The ANC vote to support the application of the public space at Compass Coffee.

Motion passes with unanimous consent.

Eastern Downtown Protected Bike Lanes Study

Recommendation: Committee voted unanimously to support options 3 or 4 of DDOT's Eastern Downtown Protected Bike Lane Expansion dependent upon the decision of the full ANC 1B commission and/or DDOT final determination.

Motion passes with unanimous consent.

Extension of the 15th Street Cycle Track

The committee voted unanimously to support the extension of the cycle track, pending receipt of the official NOI. Motion to support expansion to Euclid Street with two lanes.

Motion passes with unanimous consent.

Capital Bike Share – 14th and Girard Street NW

Recommendation: Committee voted unanimously to support the installation of the new bikeshare station with the following recommendations:

- o Encourage utilization of diagonal parking stations versus the perpendicular parking stations utilized throughout W.D.C.
- o Place the bikeshare station as far south and as close to the existing tree-line on 14th Street as possible to mitigate any potential damage from vehicles (the corner of 14th and Girard has a history of vehicles jumping the curve).

Commissioner Smith motioned to support the installation of a bike share lane on 14th and Girard Street.

8 yeas, 0 nays, 0 abstentions. Motion passed.

Pizzeria Vetri Sidewalk Café Permit (2221 14th Street NW)

Recommendation: Commissioner Brown moved to support the settlement agreement mentioned earlier under the agreement that Pizzeria Vetri will establish permanent tree barriers and clearly define the space with the barriers.

Motion passes with unanimous consent.

Woodlands Vegan Bistro Sidewalk Café Permit (2928 Georgia Avenue NW)

Recommendation: The committee voted unanimously to reject the current application (10223971) based on the aforementioned exception and will revisit the proposal in April. Commissioner Gilliland moved to seek an extension for the ANC to reply, and to oppose the application.
